When you use an Orion underground electric cable map you need to be aware that:

The map is a guide only

Measurements shown on the map are an indication only. Kerbs, fences, and road boundaries may have moved over time. We cannot warrant the accuracy of our maps, and your use of our maps is at your risk. We recommend care and caution in use of our maps.

You need to be familiar, and comply, with the guidelines outlined in the OSH publication:

Also be aware that:

- Electronic location using an approved location device should be undertaken before digging around our electric cables.
- If you have any doubt at all about the location of our electric cables, please contact us before you dig (0800 363 9898).
- We regularly update our maps. You must ensure that the map you are using is the most recent map before digging.
- Other cables may also be on or near Orion's electric cables and you need to obtain independent advice about them. These cables may belong to other owners and may be used for such things as park floodlights, traffic lights and school grounds.
- If an Orion electric cable is hit, immediately call us on 0800 363 9898 (24 hour hotline). All work in the vicinity of the electric cable must stop and the work site made safe.

66kV/33kV cable damage
can cause widespread power loss

If you are digging within two metres of a 66kV or 33kV cable, then before excavation begins you must arrange for an Orion representative to be on site. 24 hours notice is needed to arrange this (0800 363 9898).

Private electric cables
are not usually shown on our maps

Please contact the property owner about the position of any electric cables on their property. We recommend that an electronic cable location device be used.

You may be liable for any damages that result when you dig near or on one or more of our underground cables.
